

Rick Rack Quilt Pattern

Finished Top Size: Approximately 49" x 62"

Binding: Cut 2½" wide

Fabric Requirements & Cutting Instructions:

Three yards total, one yard of each fabric

Fabric #1:

Cut four 3¾" x WOF strips for Assembly "A"

Cut five 3½" x WOF strips for Border #2

Fabric #2:

Cut four 3¾" x WOF strips for Assembly "A"

Cut four 3¾" x WOF strips for Assembly "B"

Fabric #3:

Cut four 3¾" x WOF strips for Assembly "B"

Cut five 2½" x WOF strips for Border #1



Step 1: Assembly "A"

Sew long edges of one Fabric #1 3¾" x WOF strip and one Fabric #2 3¾" x WOF strip together. Repeat with remaining strips to make four "A" Assemblies. Cut into twenty four 7" x 7" Block "A"s.

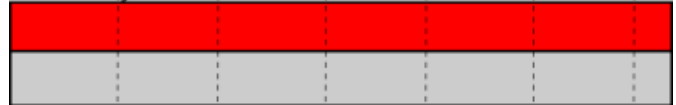

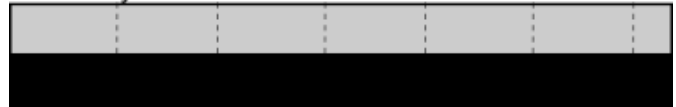
Step 2: Assembly "B"

Sew long edges of one Fabric #2 3¾" x WOF strip and one Fabric #3 3¾" x WOF strip together. Repeat with remaining strips to make four "B" Assemblies. Cut into twenty four 7" x 7" Block "B"s.

Step 3: Row Assembly

Refer to the Row Assembly Diagram, alternating Block "A"s and Block "B"s as shown. Assemble two of each row for a total of eight rows.

Step 4: Quilt Assembly

Using one each of Row #1 through Row #4, sew rows together; repeat. Will have two sections. Sew sections together.

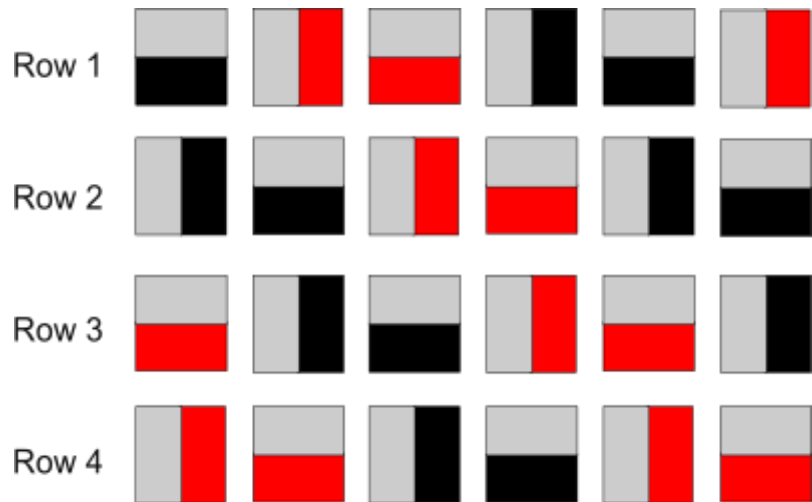


Step 5: Borders

For border #1 using fabric #3, sew the 2½" WOF strips together end to end.

Cut two strips of assembled border to the same measurement as the length of the assembled top. Find the middle of the quilt top and the middle of the border. Pin fabrics together at this point. Pin remainder; right sides of fabric together. (Goal is to avoid wavy borders) Sew. Repeat this process for the top and bottom of the quilt top. For border #2, repeat the process for border #1 using Fabric #1 3 ½" WOF strips.
